# TOWN OF SAINT ANDREWS BY-LAW NO. 16-02

### HERITAGE CONSERVATION BY-LAW

The Council of the Town of Saint Andrews, under the authority vested in it by the Heritage Conservation Act, Chapter H-4.05, Statutes of New Brunswick 2010, enacts as follows:

### 1. DEFINITIONS

- "Act" means the Heritage Conservation Act, S.N.B. 2010, Chapter H-4.05, as amended or replaced from time to time.
- "Board" means the Heritage Board of the Town of Saint Andrews appointed pursuant to the Act.
- "Character-defining elements" means the exterior features, materials, forms and spatial configurations of a structure or property that exemplify its historic architectural style, time period and or heritage value.
- "Council" means the municipal Council of the Town of Saint Andrews, New Brunswick.
- "Design guidelines" means design principles and standards which are adopted by the Board from time to time to guide decision-making regarding development within a Heritage Conservation Area.
- "**Development**" means development as defined in the Community Planning Act, R.S.N.B. 1973, Chapter C-12, as amended or replaced from time to time.
- **"Heritage Conservation Area"** means a municipal heritage conservation area established under Section 55(2) of the *Act* and Section 2 of this by-law.
- "Heritage Officer" means a heritage officer appointed by the *Council* under Section 54 of the *Act*, or his or her designate.
- "Heritage Permit" means a municipal heritage permit provided for by the Act.
- "Heritage value" means the aesthetic, historic, scientific, cultural, social or spiritual importance or significance of a place for past, present or future generations, embodied in its character-defining materials, forms, location, spatial configurations, uses and cultural associations or meanings.
- "Structure" means anything constructed or erected on or below the ground or attached to something on the ground, and includes all buildings.
- "Town Plat" means the 1786 Saint Andrews Town Plat as identified in the land grant documents on file with the Town of Saint Andrews, and shown on Schedule C as the combined area of the Town Plat and Historic Business District Heritage Conservation Areas.

### 2. HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS AND BY-LAW APPLICATION

- 1) The *Council* establishes the Historic Business District, as shown in Schedule C, as the Historic Business District Heritage Conservation Area.
- 2) The *Council* establishes the remainder of the Town Plat, as shown in Schedule C, as the Town Plat Heritage Conservation Area.
- 3) The *Council* establishes as Individual Heritage Conservation Areas the properties listed in Schedule B, and shown in Schedule C, which are within the municipality but are outside of the Town Plat.
- 4) This by-law shall apply to the Heritage Conservation Areas established above.

### 3. ADMINISTRATION

To ensure consistent policies for conserving the architectural, historical and visual heritage of the Town of Saint Andrews, the *Board* shall:

- 1) Administer this by-law in accordance with the Act.
- 2) Undertake additional heritage responsibilities that are assigned by the Council.
- 3) Adopt *design guidelines* that give direction to the public on the design principles and standards for the Heritage Conservation Areas, and to the *Board* and *Heritage Officer* in assessing applications for a *Heritage Permit*.
- 4) Establish and maintain an inventory of the *structures* on properties designated for heritage conservation under this by-law. This inventory shall include photographs, descriptions, *character-defining elements* and other information relevant to the architectural and other features to be conserved.
- 5) Make reasonable effort to ensure the owners of these properties aware of the *character-defining elements* and other heritage features of their properties and *structures*, and make advice available on their conservation.

### 4. HERITAGE PERMIT

- 1) No development specified in this by-law shall be carried out, whether or not any other municipal permit is issued, until a *Heritage Permit* has been issued and
  - a) Every right of appeal under the Act has been exercised, or
  - b) The time prescribed for the exercise of such rights has expired.
- 2) Applications for a *Heritage Permit* shall be submitted on the form prescribed by the *Board*. The *Board* and *Heritage Officer* will only consider applications that provide all required information, or subsequently requested information, needed to support their decision-making.
- 3) The *Board* shall issue a *Heritage Permit* if it is satisfied that an application is complete and that the proposed development complies with the by-law and the *design guidelines* adopted under Section 3(3) of this by-law, or could comply if certain terms and conditions were met, and in the latter case such terms and conditions shall form part of the permit.
- 4) When the *Board* is not satisfied that an application complies with the *design guidelines* it will give the applicant an opportunity to make representation to the Board on questions of whether the proposed development complies or could do so if the Board establishes terms and conditions on the permit.
- 5) A *Heritage Officer* may issue a *Heritage Permit* where he or she is satisfied that the application is complete and complies with the *design guidelines* for proposals related to:
  - a) Replacement of windows, doors, exterior siding and roofing,
  - b) Replacement of steps and porches, and
  - c) Sheds and garages
- 6) When a *Heritage Officer* is not satisfied that an application is complete and complies with the *design guidelines*, or may warrant potential terms or conditions, he or she shall refer the application to the *Board*.
- 7) The *Board* and *Heritage Officer* shall record all decisions to approve or deny an application and their reasons for doing so.

### 5. HISTORIC BUSINESS DISTRICT HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREA

The Town of Saint Andrews recognizes the high significance of conserving the historical and architectural streetscape of its Historic Business District. The following shall apply to all properties within this Heritage Conservation Area, whether or not they are listed in Schedule A of this by-law:

- 1) A development to the exterior of an existing structure that will be visible from a public street or principal driveway shall be consistent with its historic design and architecture and shall use building materials and façade treatments that are visually consistent with those historically used on that structure.
- 2) Development of a new structure that will be visible from a public street or principal driveway shall be designed and constructed to be consistent with the historic design, spatial configuration, architecture and building materials of existing heritage structures within the Historic Business District.

### 6. TOWN PLAT HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREA

The Town of Saint Andrews recognizes the significance of conserving the historic architectural and visual heritage of the Town Plat as a designated National Historic District. The following shall apply to all properties within the Town Plat, except those in the Historic Business District Conservation Area.

### 1) General Provisions

a) Development on properties that are not listed in Schedule A may be traditional or contemporary but shall be of a design and siting that does not detract from any adjacent heritage properties, streetscapes and patterns of open space.

## 2) Schedule A properties

Properties within the Town Plat that are listed in Schedule A are recognized to have significant *heritage values* that are to be conserved while supporting their contemporary use.

- a) A development to the exterior of an existing structure that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall conserve its *character-defining elements* and complement its primary historic architectural style.
- b) Other development, including an accessory structure, that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall be of a design and siting that is compatible with the property's *character-defining elements* and historic architectural style.

### 7. INDIVIDUAL HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS

Properties listed in Schedule B as individual Heritage Conservation Areas lie within the municipality but outside the Town Plat, and are recognized to have significant *heritage values* that are to be conserved while supporting their contemporary use.

- 1) A development to the exterior of an existing structure that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall conserve its *character-defining elements* and complement its primary historic architectural style.
- 2) Other development, including an accessory structure, that will be visible from a street or principal driveway shall be of a design and siting that is compatible with the property's *character-defining elements* and historic architectural style.

# 8. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR: SCHEDULE A AND B PROPERTIES AND HISTORIC BUSINESS DISTRICT

1) For structures located on properties within the Historic Business District Conservation Area or listed in Schedule A or Schedule B of this by-law, no *Heritage Permit* is required for ordinary maintenance, minor repairs or the replacement of damaged or deteriorated materials where these use visually-compatible materials and maintain the same appearance as those they are replacing. This does not include an alteration, replacement or other action that involves a change in design or outward appearance. Compliance with this section is to be determined by the *Heritage Officer* or the *Board* in consultation with the Building Inspector.

### 9. DEMOLITION, REMOVAL OR RELOCATION: SCHEDULE A AND B PROPERTIES

- 1) Any structure on a property listed in Schedule A or Schedule B of this by-law shall not be relocated on the same property, removed to another property within the Town Plat, or demolished without a *Heritage Permit*.
- 2) A permit for relocation on the same property or removal to another property within the Town Plat shall conform to the requirements for a new development under this by-law.
- 3) No permit for the demolition of a structure shall be issued unless:
  - a) The *Board* has determined that the structure no longer contributes to the heritage value of the property, or
  - b) The structure has been offered for sale and removal, at or below a fair market value, for a minimum of six consecutive months and no sale contract has been made. The terms and conditions for the offer and advertising of such a sale shall be approved by the *Board*; and
  - c) Failing such sale, a plan is filed and approved by the *Board* that provides for the salvage of architectural details from the structure prior to its demolition; and
  - d) A plan for site redevelopment is filed and approved by the *Board* that commits to future uses and structures that may continue to support the property's heritage value.
- 4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the demolition of any structure that the *Council* has found to be dangerous under a bylaw relating to dangerous or unsightly premises.

### 10. CONTRAVENTIONS AND PENALTIES


